Drop Camp Elk/Deer:

- For the drop camp it is best to know what we provide for you. In addition to the items listed above you will need to bring your food. Everyone has different taste and likes when it comes to preparing food and what food is eaten. So the following items are what we have in each camp for your use. One item that you bring that is important is 1lb propane bottles. With potential fire ban we provide you with cooking, and heating source utilizing the 1lb propane bottles. Rule of thumb is 1 bottle per day and increase it by .5 bottle per day for heating.
 - 2 burner camp stove
 - Single burner for water heating and an extra burner.
 - 1 propane portable heater.
 - 1 and possibly 2 lanterns depending on occupancy of camp.
 - Fire grate, (if fire bans are not in effect)
 - Flat skillet
 - round skillet
 - 2 pans (min)
 - Soup pot
 - 1 gal coffee pot for boiling water
 - smaller coffee pot with perk for coffee or water.
 - Mixing bowl
 - wash basin
 - spatula
 - whisk
 - soup spoon
 - slotted spoon
 - knives, cutting board
 - strainer, can opener, cheese grater,
 - For each person we have a min 1 of each of the following,



- Plate, bowl, coffee cup, drinking cup, fork, spoon, knife (butter and steak) We include a few more of each item for food prep, cooking, and serving.

When you are packing your food, it good to know how we put all of this on a horse. We use a soft sided panniers so we can pack several different things. For the food I use 18gal storage tote with the dimensions of 24” long 16” wide and 16” deep. You can also use a cooler with the same dimensions. The actual dimension can vary and inch or two with the width and length in any one direction but not as the overall whole. The depth dimension can vary more as it will stick out the top of the pannier and we can pack that way.

For your comfort we provide:

- Tent
- wood stove
- Cot
- pads
- chairs
- cook table
- sitting table
- In camp we will have:
 - Wood nails
 - Some cord
 - Matches
 - Fire starter
 - 2, 5 gal buckets for water
 - Cut wood
 - Axe
 - saw
 - A couple towels
 - Long lighter
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Suggestions to bring:

- Trash bags
- dish soap
- scrubby for cleaning



- zip locks
- Water must be treated, boiled, filtered, or sterilized before drinking. We provide the means to boil water. We suggest a filtration system, I use the Katadyne base camp filter bag (gravity feed) and a 5 gal collapsible water container

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Sheep and Goat Hunters:

- Bring a backpack capable of carrying meat off of the mountain. Preferably an internal frame pack.
 - Optional:
 - walking sticks, good for when things get slippery.
 - Late season goat hunters might consider ski goggles.
